#### Ministry of Education – Winter wellness guide for Tamariki

# The Ministry of Education has updated the winter wellness guidance for parents, caregivers and whānau to reflect the following points:

- If a child has been unwell with a respiratory illness other than COVID-19, they can return to school 24 hours after they have significantly improved and are behaving/eating normally.
- Following vomiting or diarrhoea, a child should be symptom free for 48 hours before they can return.
- If they still have a runny nose or dry cough without any other symptoms such as a
  fever, vomiting or diarrhoea, then they are unlikely to be infectious and can be
  considered well enough to attend school.


### **Next PTA meeting**
